General Info Chateau Belle Vue is located in Haut Medoc in the commune of Macau. Petit

Verdot is particularly important on this gravelly terroir making up 20% with Cabernet Sauvignon around 55% and Merlot around 25% also playing a part. Belle-Vue is established in 1996 when the previous owner Rémy Fouin set apart his best (Gironville) vineyards with the aim of producing a wine of... say Margaux quality: Belle-Vue directly borders the 3rd classed growth Château Giscours.

Acquired in 2004 by Vincent Mulliez, Castle BELLE-VUE comes from a land whose history is intertwined with that of Bordeaux wine. Mulliez joked that it would be a good sign when one day people would describe Giscours "as the neighbour of the famous Château Belle-Vue." But until today this is the other way around, I'm afraid.

Since the death of Vincent Mulliez in May 2010 (at 44 years of age), his wife Isabelle took over the management of the Civil Society of Gironville to pursue with determination the work begun by her husband.

This rigorous and enterprising man had succeeded in a few years to impose its three properties, Belle-Vue, Gironville and Bolaire among the best recognition in the Médoc.

Vintage The problem with the appellation of Haut-Médoc is that they are so dependent

on Cabernet Sauvignon, the late ripening variety that had such difficulty achieving full ripeness in 2012. The whole season, in stark contrast to 2011, was so late, with horrid weather during flowering resulting in very uneven

ripening even on the same bunch.

Lots of unsettled weather in spring and early summer was followed by an unusually hot, dry summer - so much so that the ripening process shut down completely at times. By early September Cabernets were a long way from

achieving not just phenolic but even sugar ripeness.

Vineyards The vineyard is maintained with care and protection reasoned yields are

restricted to obtain the best possible fruit maturity. Average vine age is 32 years, and the 15.58-hectare estate comprises 51% Cabernet Sauvignon, 28%

Merlot, 21% Petit Verdot.

Maturation Wines receive 16 months in barrel to mature, with 40% of barrels being new

and 60% having been used for one previous vintage.

Tasting Notes Fresh, Cherry, Red Fruit, Light-bodied. Rich red fruit flows on and on in this

charming little wine. The ripe tannins make it a great wine to bring home for

dinner.

Serve with Cheese & sliced deli meats; roast pork, pork ribs, steak.
