> Chateau Chasse-Spleen is the leading estate of Moulis, a small and easily overlooked commune on the left bank of the Gironde, sandwiched in the No Man's Land between St Julien to the north and Margaux to the south. . At the time of the classification (in 1855), however, Chasse-Spleen did not exist as an independent entity, and so its absence is hardly surprising. As it is, the proprietors of Chasse-Spleen must today live with the title of Cru Bourgeois, having briefly flirted with fame as a Cru Bourgeois Exceptionnel, the top tier in the subsequently annulled 2003 classification of Cru Bourgeois properties.

Vintage 2008 was marked by two climatic events: snow early April and hail end of July.

However, from June to mid-July, the plant operates guietly. Then the sun and temperature do not take off in August. Without costs, August does not heat the expected and necessary. Heavy rains during the second half of the month create excitement. The need for a sun franc continues to September 13. The rest of September and all harvest period saw a turnaround thanks an ideal time: dry, cool

night and warm day, sunny and slightly windy.

Vineyards The vineyards of Chasse-Spleen are heavily parcellated, but lie not far from Arcins, to

> the south of the gravelly hill on which sits the village of Grand Poujeaux. The soils are mostly Garonne gravel, with some chalky clay mixed in, and the 80 hectares of vines, which average 30 years of age, are largely Cabernet Sauvignon (73%), with 20% Merlot and 7% Petit Verdot. The soils between rows are ploughed rather than

planted, and harvesting is manual.

Harvest Hand harvested. Merlot: 6-15 October; Cabernet Sauvignon: 14-20 October

Petit Verdot: 16 October

Vinification/ The fruit is fermented in stainless steel and cement vats with temperature control, Maturation and then aged for between 12 and 14 months in oak barrels, of which 40% are new

each year. The wine is fined with egg white before bottling.

Tasting Notes Château Chasse Spleen produces wines rich, powerful and robust. The color is deep,

the nose aromas of red fruits and cassis with hints of cocoa and oak, the palate offers

elegant tannins.
