General Info The phylloxera crisis of the late 19th century wrought a great deal of damage to the

Médoc. This was compounded by difficulties during the First World War and problems caused by French inheritance laws that often led to vineyards being

abandoned. Some small estates disappeared entirely.

This is what happened to Château Retou-Rosset in Lamarque and Château Salva-de-Camino in Cussac-Fort-Médoc – even though both had been classified as Crus

Bourgeois – as well as another small domaine, Château Moulina.

These estates only came back to life in the 1950s, when they were acquired by the Kopp family. While houses remained on the various domaines, many of the plots had lain fallow or been broken up and sold over the years. Only the cellars at Château Camino-Salva were in a fit state to be used.

The vineyards were reconstituted and replanted with infinite patience. The estate still belongs to the Kopp family: father, daughter, and son-in-law.

Vineyards Château du Retout presently has 34 hectares of vines: 32 hectares in the Haut-Médoc

appellation and 2 hectares of mixed white wine varieties.

The vineyard is mostly located on a gravelly rise. A mill dating from the 13th century is in the middle of the vineyard, at its highest point (altitude of 17 metres). The terroir consists of two main soil types: clay and gravel at the bottom of the rise and deep Garonne gravel on the top.

The vines (68% Cabernet Sauvignon, 25% Merlot and 7% Petit Verdot) are an average 30 years old and vine density is 6,666 per hectare.

**Harvest** Merlot: the 29-30th of September and the 07th of October.

Petit Verdot: the 06th of October.

Cabernet Sauvignon: from the 08th to the 20th of October.

Cabernet Franc: the 21st of October.

Between 28 to 41 days

**Maturation** In french oak barrels with 37 % new ones for 12 months.

Tasting Notes With a high percentage of cabernet sauvignon, show a deep dark red color. The nose

is very aromatic with black fruits notes like blackberry and "burlat" cherry. The mouth is structured and rich with a good volume and length. The tannins are concentrated but appear silky and persistent. The good balance between alcohol and acidity give at

Chateau du Retout 2014 a long ageing potential.
