Sustainability

https://fleurcardinale.com/en/les vins/chateau-fleur-cardinale-2021/ We are committed to sustainable and precise winegrowing methods that allow us to optimize the tremendous potential of our different terroirs and ensure regular quality while respecting the environment.

In 2021, we decided to start our conversion to organic farming. This conversion, which lasts for a period of three years, will begin this year, and will be completed in 2024, by which time we aim to have the entirety of our vineyards, both red and white varieties, certified as organically-farmed.

Since 2017, we no longer use organic fertilisers, except on rare occasions and then in a very limited way. Instead, we use vegetal cover crops over the entirety of the estate, grown from seed between the vine rows.

Additionally, we don't burn the freshly pruned vine shoots cut away during the winter. Instead, we mulch them into the vineyard soil, thereby providing nourishment for the vines without any added fertiliser.

General Info

The estate was bought in 2001 by Florence and Dominique Decoster, and it has benefited from major investments which have made Château Fleur Cardinale one of the top names of the appellation. It is located to the east of the village of Saint-Émilion, on one of the high points of the appellation and it extends over 20 hectares. With its great value for money, and showing great consistency in its quality, Château Fleur Cardinale was promoted to "Saint-Emilion Grand cru classé" in 2006.

Winemaker Vintage

If 2021 was drier than previous years, two intense climatic episodes impacted the vintage. The first one is the April frost which mobilized our teams for 9 nights. The second is linked to the strong episodes of rain in June, with nearly 180 mm of

precipitation. The trio August / September / October was accompanied by low rainfall, allowing to harvest in optimal conditions and preserving the qualitative potential of the vintage.

Vineyards

The vineyard is planted in a clay-limestone soil in the middle of the plateau on a pleasant late producing terroir. The two properties owned by Florence and Dominique Decoster extend across a 23.5-hectare area for the Château Fleur Cardinale, and a 4-hectare area for the Château Croix Cardinale.

The two vineyards are planted on clay-limestone soil in the middle of the hillsides, and they enjoy an identical harvest, notable for its 75% dominance of Merlot together with 20% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet

Surface area in production: 44.46 acres (18 ha); Density of plantation: 6000 vines/hectare Average age of vines: 35 years old; Yield after sorting: 30 hl/ha

The vineyard is farmed using organic, self-sustainable farming techniques. In 2013, Fleur Cardinale was awarded their certification by the Environmental Management System (S.M.E.).

Harvest

Harvested from 1st to 12th October. Yields: 21hl/ha

Vinification & Maturation Vinification takes place in 20 small, thermoregulated, stainless steel vats. The number of vats is equal to the various parcels of vines. This allows the vinification to be done on a parcel-by-parcel basis. The vats range in size from 21 hectoliters up to 52 hectoliters. Made in a mix of tanks and wooden vats. There are 10 wood vats of 500L. Vatting time is 28 days. Malolactic fermentation takes place in 100% new oak barrels and in tank. Aged for 12-14 months in Old Merlot and old Cabernet Franc barrels, plus two 750-litre Tava amphoras

Tasting Notes

Château Fleur Cardinale 2021 takes you by surprise with its chiselled aromatic nose, its bright aromas of fresh blueberries and raspberries, highlighted by floral nuances. With real density, it unfolds into a beautiful creaminess. Its fine silky tannins give it a good length with a real freshness. After the tremors of an eventful beginning, 2021 appears more than any other as a fine vintage destined for the well-deserved rest of a lengthy maturation.
