The summer was hot and especially dry, marking the birth of this great vintage, boasting a stunning maturing ability. Graphite, aromatic herbs, black berries, mild spices, this Clos du Marquis is unique in its complexity and freshness, its power and elegance, its outstanding ageing potential and its balance certainly one of the most beautiful vintages of this wine. Grapes are harvested by hand and fermented in temperature-controlled wood, concrete, or stainless-steel vats of varying size. The stainless-steel tanks range from 40 hectoliters all the way up to 216 hectoliters. The oak vats also range in size from 176 hectoliters up to 270 hectoliters per vat. The oak vats also range in age, with the oldest vats dating back close to 50 years! Malolactic fermentation takes place in tank. Aged in 50% new oak.		
Tasting Notes Serve with	The fruit here carries attractive black cherry and griddled hedgerow character, with a soft and diffuse warmth to it, wrapped up in coffee grounds and touches of black pepper. The palate follows the lead of the nose, with scented black fruits, nuanced with threads of tobacco, graphite, and pencil shavings, along with more of that peppery spice. Good density to it though, and a gentle, silken feel to the finish. The wines from Leoville Las Cases are best served at 15.5 degrees Celsius, 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The cool, almost cellar temperature gives the wine more freshness and lift. Best served with all types of classic meat

"The 2018 Clos du Marquis is composed of 64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot and 6% Cabernet Franc, with 13% press wine added back to the blend. The wine has 14.5% alcohol and was aged in 55% new barriques. Deep garnet-purple colored, it strolls confidently out of the glass with notes of warm cassis, ripe black plums and boysenberries and hints of underbrush, cedar chest, graphite, and black olives plus a touch of baking spices. The medium to full-bodied palate is jam-packed with juicy blackberry layers, supported by firm, grainy tannins, and bags of freshness, finishing long with an invigorating burst. 2023 - 2040." - LPB, Wine Advocate

"The 2018 Clos du Marquis is consistent with my tasting note from barrel. The palate is rich and powerful, rounded in texture with white pepper and thyme infusing the black fruit. "The 2018 Clos du Marquis is so expressive, and frankly, delicious. In 2018 there is a bit more richness than typical, but that is 2018. "A blend of 64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, and the rest Cabernet Franc, the 2018 Clos Du Marquis offers a brilliant nose of ripe black cherries, smoked tobacco, cedar pencil, and violet-laced aromas. These carry to a full-bodied, rich, concentrated 2018 with plenty of background oak, a juicy spine of acidity, rock star levels of concentration and mid-palate depth, and ripe, silky tannins. "Rocking stuff, the 2018 Clos du Marquis checks in 64% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30% Merlot, and 6% Cabernet Franc that hit 14.5% alcohol with a healthy pH of 3.64 and an IPT of 79. It boasts a deep, saturated purple color as well as ripe, powerful, yet complex aromatics. Full-bodied and rich, with a stacked mid-palate, this beauty builds on the palate with ripe, polished tannin, ample oomph, and a great finish. It's a powerful, concentrated wine from the team at Léoville Las Cases that will benefit from 5-7 years of bottle age and keep for two decades."

"(64 Cabernet Sauvignon, 30 Merlot, 6 Cabernet Franc) | 55% new oak | 14.5% alc | 79 IPT This is a restrained and not too demonstrative Clos de Marquis with lovely texture and length and also a silkiness which is incredibly attractive already. The tannins counterbalance the fruit perfectly and the overall feel is of an incredibly good wine with superb freshness and plum fruit which is not too dark or overbearing. "The nose is fruity, fresh, and mineral. It reveals notes of cassis, blackberry and small notes of ripe wild red berries associated with fine touches of fresh flowers, fleshy / juicy berries as well as slight hints of Sichuan pepper and spices. The palate is fruity, well-balanced, well-built and offers a beautiful fleshiness, gourmandise, a mineral frame, power as well as a beautiful freshness. On the palate this wine expresses notes of fleshy cassis, fleshy strawberry and small notes of fleshy blackberry associated with small / fine touches of licorice, toasted, tonka bean as well as discreet oaky / caramelized hints and an imperceptible hint of blond tobacco (in the background).
