General Info Chateau Leoville Las Cases is a second growth Bordeaux estate located on the northern end

of the Saint-Julien appellation adjacent to the Gironde River. Leoville Las Cases is a perfect example of why the 1855 Bordeaux classification desperately needs to be updated.

Although rated a second growth, Leoville Las Cases consistently produces wine of first

growth quality. Like its next-door neighbor, Chateau Latour, Leoville Las Cases maintains a reputation for making stellar wine even in difficult vintages. It is the undisputed crown

jewel of St. Julien, and unequivocally one of the best wines in Bordeaux. Le Petit Lion du Marquis de Las Cases is the 2nd wine of Ch Leoville Las Cases.

Vintage The vintage 2012 was characterised by a slow, late growth cycle due to a very cool and wet

spring. The budburst was spread out over time and created a variation in the stages of development that was to be partially evened out by the dry, sunny period that began in mid-July. The colour change and ripening occurred in ideal weather conditions that continued through to harvest-time. The grapes remained perfectly healthy despite rainy

spells during picking.

Vineyards In recent years, several vineyard plots in the Clos Léoville Las Cases were uprooted and

replanted, and these are now coming into production. To preserve the quality level of the Grand Vin, Château Léoville Las Cases therefore decided it would create a second wine,

starting from the 2007 vintage. **Harvest** From 4th to 18th October 2012

Maturation "Petit Lion" is elaborated with the same care and the same methods as the great wine.

Harvesting is done manually. The winemaking is carried out in a wide range of wooden vats, cement or stainless steel, sizes ranging from 40 to more than 200hl, allowing to adapt to the size of batches with flexibility. The wine, after transfer, is aged about 10 months in

oak barrels (about 20% new)

Tasting Notes The Petit Lion shares the philosophy of its elder brother; it is vinified and aged in order to

preserve its fresh and ripe fruit flavor throughout its life. However, designed as a second wine, Petit Lion is more accessible and for earlier drinking with a significant proportion of

Merlot used in the blend.

Serve with Roast lamb, red meat in general, duck or goose, game.
