Chateau Cap de Faugeres is owned by Silvio Denz and consulted by Stephan von Neipperg. It is located in Sainte-Colombe, Cote de Castillon and belongs to the portfolio of neighbouring Saint Emilion property Chateau Faugeres. In 1823 the family of Pierre-Bernard (Péby) Guisez acquired the château and their descendants Péby Guisez (the French film producer) and his wife Corinne took over the estate in 1987. They are responsible for the dynamic rise in the fortunes of the château and the superb quality of its wines. Sadly, Péby Guisez died suddenly at the age of 52 and Corinne poured her energies into their dream of raising Château Faugères to the ranks of a Saint Emilion Grand Cru.

Faugères was purchased in 2005 by Silvio Denz, a wine connoisseur and Swiss perfume entrepreneur. Denz's aim is to further enhance the capabilities of the wines over the coming years. Michel Rolland was retained as consultant oenologist and Denz also brought in his friend Stephan von Neipperg, the creator of La Mondotte and owner of *Chateaux Clos de L'Oratorie*, Canon La Gaffeliere, *d'Aguilhe* and *Peyrau*, as a vineyard consultant; the talented cellar master, Alain Dourthe, has stayed on. Denz has invested in the estate, increasing the acreage of vines and creating a new winery designed by world-famous Swiss architect Mario Botta. The Côtes de Castillon Cap de Faugères, is the fourth wine of Chateau Faugeres.

After a colder winter than the average and a cool, changeable spring, flowering occurred between 26 May and 16 June. Temperatures during July, August and September remain close to the seasonal average, with no extremes. As a result, ripening was relatively slow, commencing around 14 July at Cap de Faugères, which is close to the mean for the past five years. The main characteristic of the weather in 2010 was the absence of very hot temperatures and the coolness at night, especially in August. The water deficit, particularly during the late season, was the main reason for the low yield of this vintage. The water balance was similar to the levels recorded in 2005 and lower than in 2009. The vintage benefitted from a very low level of phytosanitary pressure thanks to the perfect weather conditions throughout the year.

Vineyards

This Cotes de Castillon Bordeaux wine is a twenty-hectare vineyard planted at 6,600 vines/hectare and whose average age is 30 years. The Right Bank vineyard is planted to a varietal mix includes 85% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon. The vines are planted on the limestone plateau and on clay and limestone hillsides, immediately adjacent to Saint-Etienne-de-Lisse in the eastern portion of St. Emilion.

Harvest

Harvesting took place between 28 September and 9 October for the Merlot, finishing on 18 October for the Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon

Vinification/ Maturation finishing on 18 October for the Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon. Wine making techniques at Chateau Cap de Faugeres include a five-day cold soak before the juice is carefully moved by gravity into stainless steel tanks. Next, the wine undergoes a 40-day cold maceration. Malolactic takes place in tank before the wine is moved from the barrel for an anticipated 12 months aging in French oak. Six different coopers are used. The blend is always close to the Bordeaux wine vineyards plantings of 85% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauv. The 2010 vintage is characterized by very intense colour and a rich range of aromas

thanks to the wide day-night temperature variations. The 2010 Cap de Faugères wines have a solid tannic structure, with great elegance and vivacity. The finish is long, on lingering fruit notes.
