General Info Bought back in 1989, the Château Côte Montpezat is situated in Belvès de Castillon

on the appellation of controlled origin Côtes de Castillon. The estate has been owned

by Dominique Bessineau since 1989.

This wine is named after an old legend which says that those who listen closely inside the well at Château Côte Montpezat can hear the pilgrims of Saint Jacques de Compostelle. When crossing the grounds of this château, these pilgrims quenched their thirst in the well, and an ancient document of the XVII century attests this

stopover.

Vintage After the very cold and dry winter of 2011–2012, bud break lasted throughout April. The rains of April and May, coupled with mild temperatures, resulted in significant

mineralization and strong vegetative growth of the vines.

Flowering was late (29 May) and drawn out, with a delicate fruit set. The old Merlot plants have at times seen yields reduced due to coulure (shatter, a failure of the fruit to set) or millerandage (shot grapes, incomplete development).

There was settled summer weather from 15 July, with the hottest August since 2003, allowing partial recovery of the growth cycle. From mid-July onwards, 2012 was one of the driest vintages of recent years (along with 2005, 2009 and 2010), resulting in a significant water deficit (120mm lower than the thirty-year average). Ripening in early August was prolonged, with peaks of temperature from July to September and reduced rainfall. The biggest daily temperature difference recorded was 12.9°C, the highest in eight years, favouring a high level of anthocyanins and aromatic intensity. September and October were mild, close to the seasonal norm (27–28°C on 5

October).

Vineyards Usually aged from 27 to 30 years, on a clay and limestone earth and fully exposed to

the southern sun, the vineyard is 30 hectares in size and is composed of a 70 % Merlot variety, 20 % Cabernet Franc and 10 % Cabernet Sauvignon. 40 Kms to the East of Bordeaux, in the prolonged area of the appellation Saint-Emilion. Here one will find the appellations Puisseguin Saint-Emilion and Côtes de Castillon. It is on this

limestone and clay earth that are born the great wines we provide.

Harvest 100 % handpicked. Average yield: 49 hectoliters / hectare

Maturation Bottled at the castle after 18 months of aging without fining or filtration. Barrels in

which to mature red wines come from Lafite Rothschild, Smith Haut Laffite and Pape $\,$

Clément and for white wines from Château d Yquem.

Tasting Notes The nose reveals warm aromas and notes of ripe fruit associated with a few notes of

spices, dried leaves and wood. The palate is fresh, relatively precise and reveals a certain tension. In the mouth it expresses notes of blueberry, blackcurrant and strawberry associated with a few notes of sweet spices (especially vanilla) and wood.

Good length.

Serve with It will taste ideally at a temperature of 16 ° -18 ° with red meats, game, stews as

lamprey, veal and hard cheese. It will be very pleasant to drink young, but its terroir

allows a long aging between 10 and 15 years.
