After the war, the estate fell into disrepair and the quality of the wine was nothing to write home about - in fact the whole production was sold to the local co-operative. In 1994, Marie-Dominique et Jean Watrin, captivated by the charm of this hillside estate overlooking the Garonne, bought it and launched a complete restructuring of the vineyard and renovation of the winery. Château Le Doyenné results from the mature parcels of vines. The wine is aged in oak barrels for 18 months. Dark ruby or purple color, aromas of black fruit and fine woody notes. Beautiful aptitude for ageing. The red is a blend of 70% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Cabernet Franc and is fast becoming one of the stars of the appellation. There is also a minuscule production of around 60 cases of white wine, made from a blend of 40%
