Winemaker Vintage	Christian Elia Bordeaux 2018 will be remembered as an exceptional year, with no shortage of outstanding wines from this extraordinary vintage. The weather too has been exceptional, with a glorious summer extending long into the September and early- October harvest, but the vintage had begun with a bizarrely challenging first half of the growing season. It has ended up, not for the first time, as a year of mixed fortunes. With the warm summer, it was little wonder that the harvest kicked off early for the whites, with several blocks of Sauvignon Blanc being picked as early as 21 August.	CHATEAU

Vinification/ Maturation Tasting Notes	Cold pre-fermentation for 3 to 4 weeks, then alcoholic fermentation in small thermo- regulated vats. French oak barrels, 50% of new wood, for 12 months. Born and raised on our magnificent soil of gravel and pebbles, our great reds perfectly express our terroir. They are full bodied and powerful when young, smooth and ample when the years have passed. The limestone and clay subsoil provides good balance. This wine combines freshness and refinement thanks to our two key grape varieties, Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. The bouquet is dominated by red fruit aromas, which is also the case on the palate where spices and, for vintages in the hotter years, notes of blackberry and grilled almonds are also present. Made from a blend of Merlot (60%) and Cabernet Sauvignon (40%), Château de Chantegrive 2018 reflects all the typicity of the Graves terroir. In a very great vintage for the Bordeaux region, the Graves rouge Château de Chantegrive 2018 seduces with its aromatic complexity combining notes of ripe fruit with woody and toasted notes while the palate envelops the palate with its ample and silky substance. A sure bet from Graves.	
Production Serve with	12,500 cases made Chateau Chantegrive is best served at 15.5 degrees Celsius, 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The cool, almost cellar temperature gives the wine more freshness and lift. The red wine of Chateau Chantegrive is best served with all types of classic meat dishes, veal, pork, beef, lamb, duck, game, roast chicken, roasted, braised and grilled dishes.
