Château Chasse-Spleen is the leading Moulis estate along with Château Poujeaux. Although it is classified only as a Cru Bourgeois, it regularly outperforms many of the Médoc's more renowned classed growths. There are two theories behind the château's rather unusual name: firstly, that, when Lord Byron visited the estate in 1821, he remarked `Quel remède pour chasser le spleen`. Secondly, that it is named after Baudelaire's poem, Spleen. Chasse-Spleen's wines were always noteworthy, though the quality improved dramatically with its acquisition by the Taillan Group, which also owns Château Haut-Bages-Libéral, in 1976. It was run by Bernadette Villars until she and her husband were killed in an accident while hiking in the Pyrénées in 1992. The

property is now run by her daughter Claire.

Vintage

Immediately after the harvest, the rain is falling heavily. It stops a little bit in December but start all over again in January. The winter is limited to a few rare cold and frosted days with abundant rains. The spring happens without specific climatic event. June is suddenly very hot. The flowering likes that. July is canicular, the vine suffers. August gives it a respite. Its rains of the early month are perfect for the veraison. September is beautiful.

The harvest begins late. We escape to a couple of heavy storms. The merlot mature quietly. Temperatures are quite low and the nights, very cold. The cabernet sauvignon brakes. Rains relaunch them but sudden warm nights and days worry. The atmosphere is concerned but the result comforting.

Harvest

Merlot: from the 22nd to the 30th of September.

Cabernet Sauvignon: from the 30th of September to the 12th of October.

Petit Verdot: from the 2nd of October to the 3rd of October.

Cabernet Franc: from the 28th of September to the 6th of October.

Vineyards

The vineyards of Chasse-Spleen are heavily parcellated, but lie not far from Arcins, to the south of the gravelly hill on which sits the village of Grand Poujeaux. The soils are mostly Garonne gravel, with some chalky clay mixed in, and the 80 hectares of vines, which average 30 years of age, are largely Cabernet Sauvignon (73%), with 20% Merlot and 7% Petit Verdot. The soils between rows are ploughed rather than planted, and harvesting is manual.

Maturation

The fruit is fermented in stainless steel and cement vats with temperature control, and then aged for between 12 and 14 months in oak barrels, of which 40% are new each year. The wine is fined with egg white before bottling.

Tasting Notes

The wine is brilliant and limpid. The robe is an intense garnet. The wine is clear and right. Mulberry and raspberry aromas mixed to any greedy notes of a soft and melted ageing. The mouth is voluminous and densely framed by a fine tannin. The finale is very persistent and very mixed red fruits. A wine which is typical from the cru.

Wait until 2020 for tasting with an ageing potential until 2045.
