Website General Info http://www.lafite.com/en/chateau-lafite-rothschild/the-wines/carruades-de-lafite/ Given the refined selection of fine wines after two decades, the Carruades feature characteristics similar to those of the fine wine, but with their own personality linked to a higher percentage of Merlot in its composition, and plots of land that are clearly identified as producing Carruades. The origin of the name comes from the Carruades plateau, the name of a group of plots adjacent to the chateau's best vineyards, purchased in 1845 by Château Lafite. In the 20th century, the Carruades were marketed separately from Château Lafite before being integrated. The name Carruades adopted as the name of Château Lafite Rothschild's second wine, was

initially called "Moulin des Carruades" before the 1980's

Vintage

The weather conditions for the 2011 vintage were unusual and required all of our technical teams' vigilance and expertise. This was a very early vintage, with an exceptionally hot spring, low rainfall at the beginning of the year, but then more in the summer, and a persistent threat of powdery mildew (a vine disease that is usually quite rare in the Bordeaux region). Finally, just as we were getting ready to harvest, a huge hailstorm in the north of Pauillac and Saint Estèphe on 1 September obliged us to reorganize the picking schedule. The plots that had been affected had to be picked first; fortunately, as a result of the conditions, the grapes had ripened early, and quality was not compromised

Vineyards

Chateau Carruades de Lafite, second wine of Lafite Rothschild, is located in Pauillac. Plantings on the vineyard adjacent the chateau's best plots consist of 50 to 70% Cabernet Sauvignon, 30 to 50% Merlot and between 0 and 5% Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot.

Vinification/ Maturation **Tasting Notes** 

Wines mature for 18 to 20 months in oak barrels, 90% are old barrels and 10% are new ones. The style has more Merlot in the blend and a distinct personality. Closed nose. Very flavourful palate, fairly full-bodied with well-defined tannins. Notes of red fruit and tobacco. Aromas of coffee, tobacco and spices. A long, very wellrounded wine.

"The Second wine of Chateau Lafite. Thanks to the fact that the label design is very similar to that of Lafite itself, demand for Carruades from China has rocketed in the past few years with the result that the market price of any physical vintage is around £3000 per case. The 2011 is made from 55% Cabernet Sauvignon, 39% Merlot, and all of Lafite's Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot. There is fresh red fruit here and quite brisk acidity (some of the Cabernet Sauvignon was picked as early as September 3rd). A nice touch of nutmeg and Asian spices from the oak, this medium weight wine should give relatively early drinking."

"This is a delightful Carruades that is more open and exuberant than the grand vin. According to Charles Chevalier, the Estate Manager, there was too much rain in August and unwanted botrytis, so selection was key to their success. Since Lafite doesn't have a dedicated parcel in the vineyard for the Carruades, when the grapes are picked, it is not certain which wines will go into the grand vin or 2nd wine. The tannins on this wine are velvety and generous supporting a flavour profile that ranges from fresh Chinese red dates to cedar and cassis. A well crafted, balanced wine that will age well. Tasted in Bordeaux, France. Maturity: Drink."
