Jean-Cha Cazes, highly respected in the Médoc for his experience in viticulture and winemaking, bought the property in 1934. With his son André, he devoted all energy to Lynch-Bages for more than 35 years. In 1974, his grand-son Jean-Mie Cazes set about restructuring and managing the estate and recently, in 2006, h over the running of the property to his son Jean-Charles.	his chel
