General Info The Château was founded in the 18th century by a member of the Lynch Family. We

can trace the origin of the "Moussas" name back to the 16th century. In 1919 the property was purchased by the Castéja family, at that time also owner of Duhart-Milon and later was inherited by Emile Castéja. Philippe Castéja, Emile Castéja's son, has been in charge of the property and its vineyards since. Château Lynch-Moussas is a typical Pauillac exhibiting a dark colour, a fruitful bouquet, a lot of softness with

> Its characteristics are a precocious vintage with severe dry periods. As a result of a rather dry and mild winter bud burst was two weeks early compared to 2019: the first buds came on 26 March for the Merlots! This precocity was pushed forward with the fall of the first flowerhoods on 9 May. Then, the first half of May was relatively fresh and rainy. Veraison began on 6 July and lasted 3-4 weeks for some parcels. During this same time, from 18 June to 12 August, so during almost 2 months, we suffered from a lack of water with high temperatures, so the vegetative cycle slowed down. Like for most of top level vintages, the whole crop took place in September. We began harvesting Merlots on September 14th and finished them on September 22nd; as well as Cabernets Sauvignons on September 24th until September 30th. Superb Merlots, top quality Cabernets give this great vintage its roundness, richness, and elegance that represent the essence of the Pauillac terroir and the greatness of its

grapes.

Vineyards Chateau Lynch-Moussas' wine originates from the estate's 57 hectares of vineyards morcellated through the commune of Pauillac. The soil for these vineyards is typical of the Pauillac consisting mostly of gravel over a

limestone subsoil. The vines are divided between Cabernet Sauvignon (72%) and Merlot (25%).

Harvest Hand harvested. We began harvesting the Merlot on September 14th and finished them on September 22nd; as

well as Cabernet Sauvignon on September 24th until September 30th

Vinification/ 15 to 20 days of fermentation in thermo regulated stainless steel tanks. Aged in French oak barrels (about 60 % Maturation of new barrels) for 18 months.

Winemaker's The 2020 Chateau Lynch-Moussas reveals an intense color adorned with purplish tints. The aromatic bouquet Notes

unveils expressions of blackcurrant and black fruits which harmonize with a hint of licorice. The 2020 Chateau Lynch-Moussas is a greatly elegant wine with a smooth attack and an elongated structure. The charm and

delicacy of its style balances wonderfully with the expression of the power of its terroir.

Serve with Risotto with ceps, leg of lamb, beef fillet, doe stew, mutton chops. Enjoy with short ribs and creamy polenta,

braised lamb shank with rosemary or thinly-sliced London broil.

Production Approx. 15,000 cases are made annually.

"The 2020 Lynch-Moussas is composed of 72% Cabernet Sauvignon and 28% Merlot, with an alcohol of 13.5%. It is being aged for 12-14 months in French oak barrels, 60% new. Medium to deep purple-black colored, it gives up notes of crushed blackcurrants, fresh blackberries, and Bing cherries, with touches of bay leaves, tree bark and graphite. The medium-bodied palate has well-managed tannins and just enough freshness for the subtle black fruit and dried herbs flavors, taking a slight dip in the mid-palate and finishing a tad abruptly."
