The palate is medium-bodied with dusty black fruit, moderate acidity, a little smudged, but there is an appealing roundness to its texture. It needs more freshness and substance though. Not bad for a second wine, but it does miss a bit of pizzazz. Tasted January 2016."

"The Fugue de Nenin, a blend of 82% Merlot and 18% Cabernet Franc, has a certain brightness on the nose with cassis and violet scents, almost like a Margaux. The palate is medium-bodied with crisp, rather chalky tannins and a slightly abrupt, punchy finish with hints of dark chocolate on the aftertaste. Fine. Tasted April 2013."
