La Chenade is produced by Chateau Les Cruzelles in Lalande-de-Pomerol, which is owned by Denis Durantou - better known for his famous Pomerol estate, Chateau L'Eglise Clinet. Located in the commune of Neac, the Lez Cruzelles vineyards are only about 1 kilometer from Chateau L'Eglise Clinet - in fact, they are so close you can see Les Cruzelles from L'Eglise.

Elegant and aromatic, this is a classy charmer. Mostly Merlot from sandier soils, it reveals brighter aromatics of wild strawberries, with Cabernet Franc touching the background with darker fruit and some structure. La Chenade is in Lalande-de-Pomerol and only 1 Kilometer from its parent estate in Pomerol - the famous Chateau L'Eglise Clinet. With serious pedigree and obvious pleasure in the glass, La Chenade is perfect for the dinner table now (especially decanted) or to lay down a while in cellar.

2015 Pomerol wines are the stars of the vintage. 2015 Pomerol at its best can easily be described bottled decadence, hedonistic thrill rides of almost unequaled sensual pleasure. They are often close in quality to the best 2009 Pomerol wines. There are also several chateaux that have really kicked their game up to an entirely new level with this vintage. Those producers made better wine in 2015 than they did 6 years ago, in the 2009 vintage. 2009 has been my personal benchmark vintage for Pomerol, so that is saying something.

2015 Pomerol is the product of a near perfect growing season. A mild winter led to a warm, spring. Budbreak took place slightly later than usual in mid-April. The spring was sunny and warm. The flowering, in early June was quick and even, two very important factors that need to take place in a great vintage. Perhaps the hot, dry, almost drought conditions from June 15 to July 22, with absolutely no rain had the biggest impact on the 2015 Pomerol wines. Had those dry conditions continued, the vintage could have turned out completely different. But the August rains provided the necessary moisture for the growth cycle to continue. With one exception, the best 2015 Pomerol wines were all produced from estates with deep clay soils. With 2015 Pomerol, most of the growers started picking Merlot by September 15.

With very few exceptions, the Cabernet Franc was brought in by the start of October. The Merlot was picked between September 15-25 and the Cabernet Franc was picked

on October 5, 2015

The 10 hectares of Les Cruzelles are planted to 60% Merlot and 40% Cabernet Franc. This could be the highest proportion of Cabernet Franc in the appellation. The terroir

is clay and gravel soil.

There is a second wine, Chateau La Chenade, which is aged in an average of 30% new, French oak barrels. Chateau La Chenade is produced from the estates young vines and includes more Cabernet Franc in the blend. La Chenade also includes more Cabernet Franc in the blend to give it more structure. La Chenade is aged in an average of 25% new, French oak barrels. On average, the production of Chateau Les

Cruzelles is close to 1,200 cases of wine per vintage.

A very impressive La Chenade with a longer finish than usual and more layers and tension. There are some refreshing herbal / mint notes which break up the density of

the fruit and the overall feeling is refreshing which is exciting given the depth of sooty

fruit in the mid-palate.

Chateau La Chenade is best paired with all types of classic meat dishes, veal, pork, Serve with

beef, lamb, duck, game, roast chicken, roasted, braised and grilled dishes.
