The name of Berliquet is one of the oldest Saint-Emilion vineyard, this one is already on the cards Belleyme in 1768. Château Berliquet is located on the Magdelaine plateau, a few hundred meters from the village of Saint-Emilion.

This is one of the oldest estates in the region, and Berliquet is included on the famous map drawn by Belleyme (an engineer working for King Louis XV) in 1768. In 1829, Berliquet was considered one of Saint Emilion's five grands crus. The estate currently belongs to SCEA Château Berliquet, managed by Patrick and Jérôme de Lesquen. The classification of 1986 allowed the castle Berliquet to find the place it held among the great wines of Saint Emilion. The year 1996 marked a turning point in the life of the castle Berliquet. With the support of Patrick Valette, Patrick De Lesquen and his team do their utmost to establish the reputation of the castle Berliquet.

The castle Berliquet listens to determine the optimum time for harvest. Thus the castle Berliquet puts all his skills to bring you the best of its soil.

Vintage

Precisely as in other parts of Bordeaux, the weather conditions in Saint-Émilion were extremely advantageous in August and September, and it resulted in wonderfully ripe Merlot and as so equally ripe Cabernet Franc. But unlike 1998, when August was tropically hot and had high desert-like humidity, August in 2000 was very dry and with comfortably low humidity. September 1998 began with some rain but ended with warm and sunny weather, while September 2000 enjoyed pleasant and hot weather and almost with no rain in first three weeks.

Vineyards

The 9 hectares of vines face south by southwest and border on several Premiers Grands Crus Classés. Château Berliquet is divided into three parts: the plateau (25% of the total area under vine) with clay soil on a limestone subsoil, the slope (50%) with predominantly clay soil, and the pied de côte or "foot of the slop" (25%), with a high percentage of brown clay. Grape varieties consist of Merlot (70%), Cabernet Franc (25%), and Cabernet Sauvignon (5%). The average age of the vines is about 30 years.

Maturation

Since the takeover by Patrick Valette, winemaking has continued to progress. The length of macerated berries 20 to 30 days, the fermentation is conducted in small tanks under controlled temperature between 28 °C and 30 °C, followed by malolactic fermentation in French oak barrels. The wine is in monolithic limestone quarries located in the vineyard for about fifteen months in new barrels and 90%. Strikingly graceful and deep in flavor, the 2000 Berliquet is even better than the

impressive, but broodingly tannic, 1998 from this property.

Promoted to Grand Cru Classe in 1985, Berliquet is a strong candidate for admission into the exclusive club of Saint-Emilion's Premiers Grand Crus Classes. Not only is it located on prime vineyards on the limestone plateau of Saint-Emilion, just paces away from the vineyards of superstars Chateau Magdalene and Chateau Canon, it has improved dramatically since 1997 under the tutelage of winemaker Patrick Valette.

Neither a new wave garagiste nor a hidebound traditionalist, Vallette aims to produce balanced, concentrated wines by emphasizing the vineyard over the vat house.

Resisting the current fashion for picking ultra-ripe grapes, Vallette prefers the pure flavors of grapes that have achieved a natural maturity in low-yielding vineyards. The result is a wine with lovely expression of fruit, a subtle complexity and excellent length on the palate. In 2000, the balance of fruit and tannins is just about perfect for most wine drinkers, with enough structure to allow the wine to age well for 7 to 10
