**General Info** A legend would say that the name "La Dominique" was given to the estate by rich

merchant who acquired the property at the end of the XVIII th century. He had made his fortune in the Caribbean and gave the estate the name of his favorite island. The name "La Dominique" appears on the Belleyme map published in 1785 and in the first addition of Paradaguage distribution and his favority and hi

first editions of Bordeaux and its wine» published by Editions Feret in 1868.

Chateau La Dominique is greatly located on the northwest of Saint-Emilion with a prestigious neighborhood: Chateau Cheval Blanc and Chateau Figeac on its left side, and Chateau L'Evangile and Chateau La Conseillante on the Pomerol side, just north of the estate.

The professor Henri Enjalbert who studied soils and subsoils compares those of La Dominique to those of Chateau Cheval Blanc and Chateau Figeac.

The estate successively belonged to the Soualle Family and the Baillencourt Family (owner of Chateau Gazin- Pomerol, adjacent of Chateau L'Evangile and Petrus) until the acquisition by Clement Fayat in1969.

Château La Dominique, a St. Emilion Grand Cru Classé property had an illustrious reputation during the 19th century which it has recently reclaimed. The catalyst for its modern renaissance was its purchase by motorway tycoon Clément Fayat in 1969. He installed a brand new cuvier and introduced new techniques in the vineyard. He also engaged the services of the ubiquitous Michel Rolland.

From spring 2012, will start a futuristic project of a wine cellar at La Dominique with an innovative reception concept designed by Jean Nouvel.

Vineyards La Dominique is located on the border with the Pomerol appellation and its vineyards

adjoin those of Cheval Blanc. The soils are a mixture of limestone, gravel, sand and clay and the 24 hectares of vineyards are planted with Merlot (86%), Cabernet Franc (12%) and Cabernet Sauvignon (2%). Average Vine age 31 years. Soil type is 25% dep gravel and 75% old sand mixed with the gravel on clay sub-layers. 7,000-9,000 vines

per hectare. Yield is 45hl/ha.

Harvest Hand harvested

Maturation The grapes are fermented in temperature-controlled, stainless steel tanks and the

wine is then aged in oak barriques (50-60% new) for 18 months.

Tasting Notes La Dominique produces intense, ultra ripe, and opulent clarets, which, while hard to

resist, tend to show at their best with 7-10 years of bottle ageing.
