In the 18th Century Château Sansonnet was the property of the Duke Decazes, Prime Minister under the reign of Louis XVIII. The historic home, restored, furnished, and redecorated now welcomes private and business guests in an elegant, typical Saint-Emilion, setting. Sharing the unique terroir of the best Saint-Emilion crus classés, Château Sansonnet is located to the Northeast of the medieval village, on the highest point of the limestone clay plateau. The property extends over 7 hectares in a single block of land surrounding the château itself. He sold Chateau Sansonnet in 1846 to General de Coutard and retired from politics in 1848.

Château Sansonnet was then bought by Prosper Robin, a cooper, in 1892 and remained in the Robin family's hand for 4 generations spanning a century until the d'Aulan family (former owners of *Piper-Heidsieck Champagne*) took it over in 1999. The d'Aulan family has owned Piper Heidsieck since the 19th century and sold the Champagne House in 1988 to the group *Rémy Martin*. Nowadays they are part of Edonia, a French family-owned negociant business which owns and distributes their wines from Château Sansonnet, *La Croix du Casse*, *Jonqueyres*, Clinet, the Argentinian *Alta Vista*, and the sweet Tokaji from *Château Dereszla*, amongst others. In 2012, Château Sansonnet joined the tight circle of Saint-Emilion's Grans Crus Classés. This distinction was a reward for constant, hard, and close work carried out on the vines with a continuous concern for quality.

Winemaker Sustainability

Jean-Philippe Fort

A restructuring of the vineyard has led to environmentally friendly practices, a pure expression of the exceptional terroir through a micro-plot approach and a renovation of the vat room and cellar. The tailor-made vinifications are carried out under the guidance of famous wine consultant Michel Rolland and Jean-Philippe Fort. All these efforts and investments have been rewarded with an improvement in the quality of the wines, whose stylistic definition comes through more and more with each new vintage, as confirmed by the 2017.

Vintage

2018 Saint Emilion was not an easy vintage for producers. The winter months were easy, but the spring is one of the wettest in history. Depending on where you located in St. Emilion, during the initial 6 months of the year, between 550 mm to 600 mm (21"-24") of rain soaked your soils. This is more than the normal amount of rain the region experiences in a year!

From there growers fended off violent attacks of mildew, which struck fast and furious. 2018 Saint Emilion was saved by the hottest, driest, sunniest vintage conditions since 2003. Barely any rain fell from July to harvest.

Picking took place under warm, sunny, and dry conditions. On average, production was down 10-20% for many vineyards. Conditions were so good between late September and mid-October; vignerons were able to pick at their chosen level of maturity.

Vineyards

Chateau Sansonnet is located in the St Emilion appellation, on the right bank of the Gironde. Its 7 hectares of vineyards are planted on the highest point of a limestone clay plateau. The vines are split into 2 varieties: 85% Merlot, 15% Cabernet Franc. In our quest for superlative quality, we are working towards a gradual transformation of the vineyard, focusing particularly on complantation work, i.e. planting different grape varieties in a specific soil type, on raising the height of the vine training and on meticulously adapting vineyard work according to the evolution and behavior of the vines.



Harvest 100% by hand the 26th of September (young vines of Merlot), 28th and 29th of September, 5th of October (Merlot), 15thof October (Cabernet Franc and Cabernet Sauvignon). Yields 35 hl/ha.

Vinification/ Maturation The 2018 vintage of this Saint-Emilion property is a blend of 90% Merlot, 7% Cabernet Franc and 3% Cabernet Sauvignon. Following a 100% manual harvest and a first sorting in the vineyard, the fruit is sorted again in the vat by densitometry to keep only those which have reached optimal ripeness.

After a cold pre-fermentation maceration to extract a wide range of aromas and colors, the wines are fermented in vats drawn regularly. The malolactic fermentation is carried out in new oak barrels. The maturation then takes 12 to 18 months, some batches (about 80%) being vinified in new barrels and others, particularly merlots, in amphoras of 7.5 hectoliters. 80% new French oak barrels for 18 months. This fully custom-made vinification is orchestrated by our œnologist, Jean-Philippe Fort, from the Michel Roland Practice!

Tasting Notes

The Chateau Sansonnet 2018 is characterized by aromas of ripe black fruits. It is a rich and dense wine that has a beautiful aromatic depth, giving it a notable length marked by spices on the palate.

"Merlots picked late September and on 5 October, but the Cabernets were not picked until 15 October. Cold pre-fermentation maceration, extraction by pigeage and/or pumping over for 20 to 28 days. Malo in barrels of 225 and 500 litres, 80% new. The young Merlots were aged in amphorae. Unnecessarily heavy bottle. Deep purplish crimson. Sumptuous nose with notes of tea leaves. Then quite marked acidity as well as very concentrated fruit and carefully managed tannins on the palate. This should age pretty well even if for the moment all the ingredients are a bit embryonic and unknit. Just a little drying on the end for the moment."
