If 2021 was drier than previous years, two intense climatic episodes impacted the vintage. The first one is the April frost which mobilized our teams for 9 nights. The second is linked to the strong episodes of rain in June, with nearly 180 mm of precipitation. The trio August / September / October was accompanied by low rainfall, allowing to harvest in optimal conditions and preserving the qualitative potential of the vintage.		

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Vineyards	While Valandraud started off as a small St. Emilion property, over the years, Jean Luc and Murielle have			
	increased holdings due to continued purchases of vineyard land. Today, the property is 10 hectares. The			
	vines are located in various areas in St. Emilion. Valandraud produces red and white wine. Aged 20 years on			
	average, the vines are planted in clay-limestone soils. 2 hectares are devoted to the production of white			
	wine.			
Harvest	Manual harvest (3 sortings) followed by storage in a cold room before pressing. The aging is carried out on lees in barrels (80% new and 20% second-fill barrels)			
	Ageing: on lees, 80% in new barrels of 225, 300 and 500 L and 20% in 1-year barrels.

"The 2021 Valandraud Blanc is a medium to full-bodied, rich, and fleshy wine bursting with aromas of orchard fruit, confit citrus and pastry cream. As ever, it's one of the fatter, more textural white wines produced in Bordeaux, even in this cooler vintage.

Jean-Luc Thunevin once worked for a bank owned by the Moueix family, and, without knowing all that much about wine, requested some bottles of the 1955 Pétrus, his wife's birth year. As a good employee, his request was gratified, and his passion for wine began; the rest is history. But today, this emblematic vin de garage has become a vin de terroir, defined by holdings on the cool, shallow clay-over-limestone soils of Saint-Étienne-de-Lisse; and the garage has become a state-of-the-art winery, with all the precision and temperature control that comes with it. The Valandraud style is undeniably fleshy and dramatic, even hedonistic, and the estate's 2021 (all 24,000 bottles of it) exemplify that style in an unusually elegant, middleweight register."

"The 2021 Valandraud Blanc is made from 50% Sauvignon Gris, 35% Sauvignon Blanc, and 15% Semillon, aging in 80% new oak barrels. It has a serious nose of pear tart, white peaches, and cedar, giving way to suggestions of fresh ginger, allspice, and coriander seed. Medium-bodied, the palate is wonderfully intense with impressive tension and loads of mineral accents coming through on the long finish." - LPB, Wine Independent

"The Grand Vin 2021 Château Valandraud Blanc is mostly Sauvignon Gris but includes 30% Sauvignon Blanc and a splash of Semillon. Crushed stone, pineapple, and bright citrus give way to a medium-bodied, concentrated, incredibly pure, precise white displaying everything that makes this vintage so promising for the whites. As with all the whites here, it has a low pH, racy acidity, yet terrific mid-palate depth, beautiful balance, and a gorgeous finish. Reviews "The nose is fresh, elegant, precise, racy and reveals a fine fleshy freshness, gourmandize and a certain finesse. There are notes of pulpy/fresh apple, crushed nectarine and more lightly citrus fruits combined with fine zest, kumquat, a subtle almost exotic fruit, crushed berries, and a subtle almost mineral crunch. The palate is fruity, fleshy, fresh, elegant and offers a nice definition, gourmandize, finesse, some volume in finesse, a nice acidic backbone, roundness, some tension in finesse, elegance as well as energy/dynamism. On the palate, this wine expresses notes of pulpy/juicy apple, ripe/pulpy lemon and more slightly crunchy nectarine combined with a fine touch of pineapple, zest, a discreet hint of lime and a subtle sapid/saline touch on the finish/persistence. Good length."
