General Info

The start of the first age of the modern era for Chateau Capbern Gasqueton begins when the Left Bank vineyards were purchased by Georges Gasqueton in 1894. The estate took its name from two of its more famous owners, the Gasqueton and Capbern families. The Gasqueton family managed the estate until 2012. Most recently, the figurehead of Chateau Capbern Gasqueton was the interestingly charming, albeit, quite eccentric Madame Denise Gasqueton. Madame Gasqueton managed the property while marching to the beat of her own drummer until she passed away at the age of 87 in late September 2011.

The following year, the second and current modern era for the chateau began July 2012 when Chateau Capbern Gasqueton and Chateau Calon were sold to the large French Insurance company, Suravenir Insurance. Jean-Pierre Moueix , the owner of Petrus and the massive negociant company Duclot, took a minority stake in Chateau Calon Segur and Chateau Capbern Gasqueton. Starting with the 2013 vintage, they dropped the second part of their name and began selling their wine under the simpler name of just Chateau Capbern.

Since the new owners took over Chateau Capbern Gasqueton, they started a serious program of improving the wine making at Chateau Capbern. While the owners began a complete renovation of the wine making facilities at Calon Segur, that was not the case with Capbern Gasqueton, because the estate renovated their wine making facilities in 2011. One of the first moves the new owners made was to hire Laurent Daffau, who quickly turned things around. In 2014, Chateau Capbern Gasqueton produced the best wine in the history of the estate!

Château Calon Ségur is also owner at Saint-Estèphe of Château Capbern.

Vineyards

The 37-hectare vineyard and chateau of Capbern is located just behind the Church of Saint Etienne in the village of Saint Estephe. The vineyard is planted to 62% Cabernet Sauvignon , 37% Merlot and 1% Petit Verdot . The terroir is a mix of gravel and clay soils. On average, the vines are close to 30 years of age. The Medoc vineyards are located in two different areas with slightly different terroirs. One part of the vineyard is situated not far from Calon Segur. The other section is closer to the Gironde river.

Harvest

Hand picking. A first selection of grapes on the vine. Mechanical sorting of the grapes by vibration, followed by hand sorting.

Temperature-controlled conical stainless-steel tanks. Maceration for 18 to 21 days.

Maturation Tasting Notes 18 months, 60% new barrels. Fining with egg white.

Here is a superb-value Saint-Estèphe, under the same ownership as Ch Calon-Ségur. The wine was blended from a higher proportion than usual – 78% – Cabernet Sauvignon, with 19% Merlot and 3% Petit Verdot. Careful vat selection took place, giving a wine of rich purple colour, with fresh, open, fully ripened aromas. The palate is well-structured, with gentle, dense fruitiness and beautifully integrating, tender tannins. Modestly priced, this will make delicious drinking from 2020 and for a further

4-8 years.

Decanting

Chateau Capbern Gasqueton is best served at 15.5 degrees Celsius, 60 degrees Fahrenheit. The cool, almost cellar temperature gives the wine more freshness and lift. Young vintages can be decanted for 1-2 hours. This allows the wine to soften and open its perfume. Older vintages might need very little decanting, just enough to remove the sediment.
