General Info Chateau Cos d'Estournel makes a second wine , Les Pagodes de Cos, which was first

produced with the 1994 vintage. Originally, the second wine was called Marbuzet. The majority of the fruit came from their vineyard called Marbuzet, hence the name. The name was changed after both properties were purchased by Michel Reybier. Today, the grapes used in the second wine, Les Pagodes de Cos can from time to time, include fruit from Marbuzet, their other estate in St. Estephe, as well as grapes from young vines and declassified wine intended for Cos d'Estournel. Since 2005, Les Pagodes de Cos has morphed into one of the better second wines in all of Bordeaux.

On average, Les Pagodes de Cos is aged in 40% new, French oak barrels.

Vintage The key features of the 2014 weather were a very irregular rainfall pattern across the

region, a cool and relatively wet August, and a magnificently long, warm, and dry autumn. September and October each had nearly one third more sunshine than usual and, respectively, one quarter and less than half their normal rainfall. Perfect

conditions, of course, for the harvest.

Vineyards The vineyard of Cos spreads around the château on 91 hectares. The Cabernet

Sauvignon vines (60% of the vineyard) find the soil of their choice in the thin layers of gravely soil situated on the top and on the southern slopes of the hill. On the other hand, the Merlot vines (40% of the vineyard) excel on the eastern slopes and on the slopes where the Saint-Estephe limestone bed shows on the surface. The percentage of Cabernet and Merlot varies from one vintage to another according to the year weather conditions, benefiting successively to the one or the other. Plantation is extremely dense (8000 to 10000 vines per hectare) and the average age of the vineyard is high (35 years old on the average) in order to enable the roots to extend excessively and to obtain a very slender yield per vine that will create the "Grand Goût" Only the wines coming from over 20 years old vines will have the name of

Château Cos d'Estournel.

Maturation Matured in 50% new oak

Tasting Notes 2010 Pagodes de Cos needs not blush in the company of many grand vins. It is totally

enchanting and worthy of the most discerning wine lover. Like the 2009, it is unquestionably an outstanding second wine. 2010 Pagodes de Cos has a truly marvelous texture. It is an opulent wine with fine, soft tannin. Fresh and long, it

exudes tremendous elegance.


