http://www.estournel.com/en/cos/wines/#wines-pagodes-de-cos Chateau Cos d'Estournel makes a second wine , Les Pagodes de Cos, which was first produced with the 1994 vintage. Originally, the second wine was called Marbuzet. The majority of the fruit came from their vineyard called Marbuzet, hence the name. The name was changed after both properties were purchased by Michel Reybier. Today, the grapes used in the second wine, Les Pagodes de Cos can from time to time, include fruit from Marbuzet, their other estate in St. Estephe, as well as grapes from young vines and declassified wine intended for Cos d'Estournel. Since 2005, Les Pagodes de Cos has morphed into one of the better second wines in all of Bordeaux.

On average, Les Pagodes de Cos is aged in 40% new, French oak barrels.

Vintage A cool winter, a warm spring, and a mixed summer; mild weather conditions for the

harvest.

- From January to March: Temperature and rainfall close to the average.

- May and June: Mild.
- July: Hot and dry.
- August and September: Cooler than average with some stormy showers in August and a rainy spell from 11 to 15 September.
- Bud burst: A little later than usual followed by very regular growth.
- Flowering: First flowers on 25 May and Full flowering on 4 June Despite a slow start to flowering, it was then rapid and even.
- Véraison: Mid-véraison on 4 August. As with the flowering, it was rapid and even.
- Leaf removal: Leaf removal between the end of June and beginning of July, adapted to the water stress of each plot, and even within plots.

Vineyards

The vineyard of Cos spreads around the château on 91 hectares. The Cabernet Sauvignon vines (60% of the vineyard) find the soil of their choice in the thin layers of gravely soil situated on the top and on the southern slopes of the hill. On the other hand, the Merlot vines (40% of the vineyard) excel on the eastern slopes and on the slopes where the Saint-Estephe limestone bed shows on the surface. The percentage of Cabernet and Merlot varies from one vintage to another according to the year weather conditions, benefiting successively to the one or the other. Plantation is extremely dense (8000 to 10000 vines per hectare) and the average age of the vineyard is high (35 years old on the average) in order to enable the roots to extend excessively and to obtain a very slender yield per vine that will create the "Grand Goût" Only the wines coming from over 20 years old vines will have the name of Château Cos d'Estournel.

Maturation

Matured in 50% new oak

Tasting Notes

Intense, refined and deep, it is perfectly balanced and voluptuous, a highly enjoyable wine. The 2015 vintage is fruity and explosive, with a silky aromatic signature. With satisfying notes of ripe fruit and fresh notes of spice, Les Pagodes de Cos 2015 is a glorious, balanced wine filled with promise.

"The 2015 Pagodes de Cos is a blend of 46.2% Merlot, 44% Cabernet Sauvignon, 5.8% Cabernet Franc and 4% Petit Verdot that will be matured in 30% new barrels. It has a generous bouquet of earthy, sous-bois-tinged black fruit, delineated if not as intense as the 2014 I recall from 12 months ago. The palate is medium-bodied and shows a little more sophisticated than the aromatics, principally because of the appealing fineness of the tannin and how well the oak is enmeshed into the fruit. That lends it a smooth and silky texture, and I suggest that after 2-3 years in bottle, this should drink nicely for up to another decade."

"Quite a lot of Merlot (from older vines) from Cos went into Pagodes this year so it is more serious version of a second wine than others in Saint-Estèphe. The tannins are a little more pronounced and keener and this in turn make the palate fascinating and in need of time to settle. This is a good wine but it's certainly atypical. In spite of the 40-degree heat, the proximity of the Gironde helped enormously to ameliorate the temperature and the fruit remained well-shaded in mid-summer because they didn't leaf-pluck. The result is one of the longest-lived Pagodes in a long while."
