"Sporting a deep garnet-purple color, the 2019 Branaire-Ducru starts off a little broody, with woodsmoke and graphite-inspired scents giving way to an emerging core of warm cassis, mulberries, and fruitcake plus touches of mocha, rose petals and bouquet garni. Medium-bodied, the palate reveals surprising energy with bags of perfumed black fruits juxtaposed by compelling tension and a fine-grained texture, beautifully supporting the tightly knit layers, finishing on a lingering mineral note. "Tobacco, mocha, cassis, blackberry, and flowers are what you initially notice. This is a sensuous, medium/fullbodied, silky, fresh, and pure wine exuding sweet, ripe, black plums, juicy blackberry, and cassis from start to finish. The lift in the endnote gives you ample time to enjoy all the purity in the fruit, which is just great. Produced from a blend of 56% Cabernet Sauvignon, 35% Merlot, 5% Petit Verdot and 4% Cabernet Franc, the wine reached 13.7% alcohol with a pH of 3.65. Harvesting took place September 19 to October 9. The Grand Vin was produced from 55% of the crop."

"The 2019 Branaire-Ducru is one that I was eager to re-taste in bottle. Deep in color, it has a very well-defined nose of tightly packed dark berries, the tobacco element less obvious than before, and slightly more floral, with light sous-bois notes developing with aeration. The 60% new oak is neatly integrated. The palate shows real vivacity and tension on the entry and delivers crunchy black fruit, touches of blue fruit and a little iodine. Sappy from start to finish, this has a real saline tang that urges you back for another sip. There is definitely is more substance compared to previous vintages, and I wager that this represents the best Branaire-Ducru in recent years."

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Reviews "The 2019 Branaire -Ducru is one instance where I felt that the first two bottles via the UGC shipment were not quite correct, so I requested two more direct from the château. They were different. It has plenty of dark berry fruit on the nose mixed with smoke, tobacco, and undergrowth scents - just classic Saint-Julien. The palate is medium-bodied with a tangy saline entry, fresh and defined by the crisp tannins. Whereas the first samples lacked a bit of cohesion, this is more focused and detailed with a seriously impressive classically styled, graphite-tinged finish. Result? "Deep ruby colour with a highly floral, fresh, and fragrant nose. The palate is lithe and pure, with red and black fruits complemented by chalky tannins. The fruit is fresh and slightly herbal, but there is no sense of under ripeness. Cool, compact, and harmonious, this should drink well from a fairly young age." - Tom Parker MW

"The nose is elegant, powerful, racy and offers a finesse of the grain, harmony, a fine complexity as well as sense of the place/terroir. It reveals notes of wild blackberry, wild strawberry, small notes of small ripe black wild fruits associated with small touches of violet, lily/tulip, crushed small cherries as well as fine hints of muscade, sweet spices and very discreet hints of vanilla/caramel (in the background). The palate is fruity, well-balanced and offers a good definition, juiciness, a fine acidulous frame, a good definition as well as gourmandize, a small tension, a fine freshness, and a small fat. On the palate this wine expresses notes of juicy wild blackberry, crushed small cherry, small notes of wild raspberry associated with small touches of pulpy cassis, small black fruits, violet, lily as well as fine hints of sweet almond/sweet spices.
